

Graduation Requirements

LCHS Interim HS Graduation Requirements for the classes of 2018, 2019, and 2020

In the spring of 2017, Lake County High School - along with the broader Lake County Community -rewrote the graduation requirements in line with the Colorado State Board of Education guidelines. The decision was made to fully adopt those requirements for all subsequent graduating classes beginning with the class of 2018. These new requirements replace the 28 credit requirement with 24 credits and an Individual Career Academic Plan, that must be approved by a teacher, parents and an administrator. However, considering staffing, course offerings, logistics of implementation, and fairness to students, the following exceptions and pathways are in effect for the classes of 2018, 2019 and 2020:

Leadership and Ethics--- This class is not required for the classes of 2018, 2019 and 2020.

Health and Wellness—this course is required for all classes starting with 2018, however other health and wellness substitutes such as CMC or AVENTA courses, may be used in place of this LCHS course.

Personal Finance—this course is not required for students in the classes of 2018 and 2019 on the Early College pathway. It is required for all other students.

Government—the class of 2018 must complete a full year of government since this rule was in effect and students were already enrolled in this course when the new requirements were adopted.
