Concurrent Enrollment Information and Updates

Hello Students and Families,

Lake County School District highly values our concurrent enrollment program. We partner with Colorado Mountain College to offer a variety of college courses. Students who are enrolled in our concurrent enrollment program can take college courses free of tuition, and can receive both college and high school credit for those courses.

We have updated our Concurrent Enrollment Policy. <u>Here</u> is a link to the new policy. Based on this policy, we are making some adjustments to the registration process starting this spring for Fall 2025 classes. Below is information on these changes, both for students who are new to concurrent enrollment and for students who are already enrolled in the program.

New Students (students who have never taken a CMC class)

- 1. Students fill out the Concurrent Enrollment Application
- 2. Student fills out the <u>CMC application</u>
  - a. Make sure to choose High School Concurrent Enrollment under "Student Type"
- 3. Student takes Placement Exam. Choose a date to take the test virtually
- 4. Student emails high school counselor to let them know they have completed steps 1-3
- 5. Counselor will notify student and parent(s)/guardian(s) once application has been approved and student is eligible to enroll in classes
- 6. Student meets with CMC CE coordinator to register for classes

Early registration for fall classes is March 31- May 4. Once steps 1-4 have been completed, the Concurrent Enrollment Coordinator, Laura Alonzo-Ochoa, will contact the student to schedule an appointment.

Returning students (students who have already taken CMC classes)

- 1. Students fill out the Concurrent Enrollment Registration form
- 2. Students meet with Laura Alonzo-Ochoa to get registered

Early registration for fall classes is March 31- May 4. Once step 1 has been completed, the Concurrent Enrollment Coordinator, Laura Alonzo-Ochoa, will contact the student to schedule an appointment.
