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IMPORTANCE OF CLEAN-UP SONG IN PRESCHOOL

According to Cheryl Gabbert, author at Bright Hub Education "Cleaning up is never fun for preschoolers, but a catchy little song can make all the difference. Songs at transition times reinforce the routine, and easily lead children into the next activity. Predictable transitions are an important way to ease the anxiety and stress of new situations. When kids follow a routine that is reinforced through transition activities, they are less likely to react to changes in a negative way. Using a clean-up transition song for preschool routine changes make for smoother transitions. Young children rely on having a predictable routine, so <u>using transition songs</u> helps students to recognize the changes that are about to take place. This makes children feel more secure, since they always know what to expect."

The Center teachers chose and voted the song "Try Everything" by Shakira, it was the theme song of the children's movie "Zootopia". Parents are welcome to use this clean-up song at home as a connection to our routine at school.

<u>Child Find</u> Early intervention for Children with special needs

Every county in Colorado has professionals who are trained to evaluate children in a variety of areas, including cognitive functioning, physical functioning, hearing and vision, speech and language and social and emotional development. This service is referred to as Child Find. Evaluations are conducted by the Child Find team at no cost to parents.

Once the child find evaluation team, which includes the parents, has gathered sufficient information used to determine a child's eligibility for early intervention or preschool special education services, an Individual Family Service Plan (IFSP; birth to three years of age) or an Individual Education Plan (IEP; three to five years of age) is developed and services begin shortly.

Children under the age of six may be referred at any time for an eligibility determination for early intervention (ages birth to three) or preschool special education services (ages three through five).


