Attendance

One way to be sure that your child is getting the most from preschool is through regular attendance. Each day's learning builds upon the day before, and when children are absent, they miss some of that learning.

Children feel most secure with a regular routine, when they know what will happen next, and preschool will provide a very predictable schedule for your child.

Of course, children get sick and families must occasionally go out of town, so please call **486-6920** if your child must be absent. This is a 24-hour voicemail number so please leave a message with the dates and reason for absence, if you do not reach a staff member in person.



Home Visits

Teachers will be contacting you to schedule your first home visit this month; the second visit will be in April.

The purposes of home visits are:

- To build a friendship and partnership between the parents and teachers
- To give you information on your child's progress
- To update your goals for your child's education
- To get your input for program improvement

Your child's teachers will make every effort to schedule the visit at a time that works for you.


Your child will love welcoming his or her teachers to your home, and it helps children feel more comfortable in preschool when they know their parents and teachers are friends.

Please remember that the teachers are required to complete a home visit with every family. You can help by working with them to schedule yours.

Transportation Tips

Buses are available for children with special needs or those enrolled in Head Start who live within our transportation area. These two programs provide funding for transporting children, and our other programs do not.

If your child rides the bus, and you need to make a change in his or her pick up or drop off, please call **486-6925 ONLY**. We listen to the messages on this line right before the buses leave, so please do not leave a message on any other telephone line. If you want to confirm that your message was received, just request that we call you and leave a number where you can be reached, and we will call you back.

Please teach your child these bus rules:

- * Stay seated with seat belt buckled
- * Obey the bus driver
- * Never throw objects
- * Talk quietly
- * Walk (don't run) when getting on and off the bus
- * Keep hands to yourself
- * No food or glass containers on bus





In addition to bus safety, your child will learn about Pedestrian Safety as they participate in walking field trips with their class throughout the year.

We are also pleased to provide car-seat safety information to help you keep your children safe all the time.

At this time you will be able to talk with the teachers about your child's progress. All parents should attend, so if you are working please arrange to meet with the teachers when you are available.

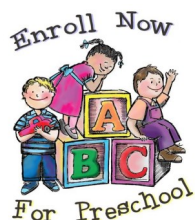
To prepare for your conference:

Preschool Enrollment Reminder:

Open enrollment for the 2019-2020 program year begins on March 1, 2019. Please stop by The Family Resource Office for an application, or contact Lisa at 486-6928 or Jenny at 486-6925 for Spanish.

All applications must be completed and received by the May 24, 2019 deadline to be considered for the upcoming 2019-2020 school year. Selection for the 2019-2020 school year preschool slots will take place on June 7, 2019.

Applications are accepted throughout the year. Typically, The Center is fully enrolled at selection. To avoid being placed on the waitlist families are encouraged to complete the applications as soon as possible.

Head Start for 2nd Year Returning Children:



Your child is automatically eligible for the second year of Head Start, **but families must complete an application to re-enroll, and bring in new Income Verification.**

If you have other children ages 3 to 5 or know of anyone that is interested in the program we are always looking for referrals.

The Power of Outdoor Play

- Studies show that fresh air can reduce the spread of colds and germs.
- The USDA recommends children move at least 60 minutes on most days, and 30 minutes for adults.
- Fall and winter play presents wonderful opportunities for children to observe and collect leaves and pinecones, make footprints and build things out of leaves and snow.
- At home, you can feed the birds by hanging apples, popcorn strings or pinecones rolled in peanut butter.
- Go for a nature walk, go sledding, or shovel and dig in the snow.
- Activity is the best gift you can give your child. Activity will help your child grow into an active adult.

Prepare Your Child For Kindergarten



Have you signed your child up for kindergarten? If he or she will be 5 years old by October 1 of this year, contact the West Park Elementary front office at 486-6890 for registration info.

There will be Transition Activities scheduled in May for you and your child to become familiar with the kindergarten program at West Park Elementary School. Please check The Center's newsletter and your child's cubby for the dates and times for these activities to ease your transition to public school.

Some things you can do to help your child get ready are:

- Visit the kindergarten rooms during transition events. Your child will feel more secure if he or she sees the classroom ahead of time.
- Show him or her where to get a drink, and where to put his or her coat and backpack.
- Visit the bathrooms.
- Use the materials given to you by the preschool and kindergarten teachers to keep your child's skills up during the summer.
- Be sure you know your rights and responsibilities. This material will be in your kindergarten handbook, available in the front office.

BE YOUR CHILD'S BIGGEST FAN



Children are looking for your approval at all times. They want to feel that they are wanted, needed, and accepted for who they are. As they begin to grow and learn about their passions, it will be important for you as their parent to do whatever you can to become your child's biggest fan.

What does it mean to be your child's biggest fan? This means that you know your child, their likes, and their dislikes. You know what they aspire to become and the heroes that they have. You are aware of why they do the things they do, and what gives them energy, and what discourages them. Think about fans of celebrities. They are aware of every single detail of that person's life and will do whatever they can to be that person's biggest proponent and ally.

As a parent, this is your job. You must take on this role with your child.

When you think about being a fan, the first thing in your mind may be sports, but encouragement can be transferred to anything, whether it is sports, band, drama, schoolwork, or helping around the house.
